

The MAPJ board met on August 20<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 pm at Radina's coffee shop meeting room. Members present were: Chair Jon Tveite, Treasurer Anne Cowan, Newsletter editor David Buck, John Exdell, Carol Barta, Christopher Renner, Greg Covington, Majka Jankowiak, Ellen Welti and MAPJ Coordinator Victor Force.

The agenda was presented to the board; Cowan asked that the budget be discussed under new business.

The minutes from the July meeting were approved.

#### **Reports-**

**Treasurer/Fundraising-** Cowan provided the board with a year-to-date budget report. Cowan reported that we have spent approximately \$13,400 and we have taken in approximately \$17,000.

Cowan commended Renner for all of his hard work for the promotion of 'Food Inc.'. The board echoed the sentiment.

**Campus/Coordinator-** Force reported that the student Amnesty International club will have an information/planning meeting on August 28. They will also table at the Union from 11-2 on September 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>.

Force also reported that the Campaign for Nonviolence kick off will take place on campus on September 21<sup>st</sup>. That day a 'Peace pole' will be dedicated at UFM in order to commemorate CNV's tenth anniversary for teaching courses on Non-Violence.

Force will attend the first Amnesty meeting and invite the students to attend "Anthrax War" being shown at the Grand ballroom September 9<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 pm.

**Monthly Movie Series-** Renner reported that nearly 150 people attended Food Inc. Renner also reported that 'Anthrax War' will be shown twice; the first showing will be at the public library auditorium on September 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm, and the second showing will be on campus at the KSU student union from 8-10 on September 9<sup>th</sup>. Eric Nadler, the co-director of the film will be present for both showings and lead the question and answer session following the viewings. In Oct. MAPJ will show 'What's The Matter with Kansas on October 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm at the public library.

Covington suggested that MAPJ purchase the film 'Superpower'. Covington thought that we could get this for \$22.00. Covington will follow up and get more information.

**KONZ radio-**Renner reported that the radio's steering committee will meet this coming Saturday. Renner reported that \$7,000 was received through the Carolyn Peine foundation and there is \$32,000 to be raised.

**Movies on the Grass-** Tveite listed the names, and places of the movies.

**Fall speaker series-** Our speaker Sarah Shields, has Sunday free, the board needs to work to get her into Sunday school classes. Also we need a working title for her lecture. Tveite will serve as the project manager the Shields visit.

**Newsletter-** Cowan reported that the newsletter committee met on August 12<sup>th</sup>. All articles are due to David Buck by August 26<sup>th</sup> and on to Renner the weekend of the 29<sup>th</sup>. People will fold the newsletter on September the 2<sup>nd</sup> and it will be mailed on the 3<sup>rd</sup>.

**Organizational change-** Tveite wanted to clarify the organizational change process. The process is:

Postcards will be mailed to MAPJ members, calls will be made by board members and the newsletter will come out reporting the up coming meeting on September 19<sup>th</sup>. Cowan will get the membership list to board members, names will be generated for volunteers to help with the calling.

**New Business**-Cowan will send the budget out to board members. The board will use part of the September meeting to finalize the budget so that we will know how much money needs to be generated for 2009-2010.

Cowan also reported that Resist has offered us \$500 to help us get Buzz Harris or another person to help with the time or organizational change. Cowan will follow up and find out how much it will cost to get Harris here.

With no further business to do the meeting was adjourned.
